JOHN WATSON WINS AL WALLACE MEMORIAL

The Ninth Annual Al Wallace Memorial was held at the Heart O' Denver Motor Hotel last March 29-31, a Five-Round Swiss with John Watson winning the Open 5-0. Some 203 players participated in the four-section event, making competition very strong, and the battle for prizes was no easy feat even for the ablest participants.

John Watson, our Open Winner, also won the 1972 Colorado Open. John has been traveling around Europe for the last two years and has just recently returned to live in Colorado. His first two games were won in less than thirty moves. Robert O'Donnell had a good and perhaps a winning position against John in the fourth round, but erred in extreme time pressure. In the fifth round, Bob Shean played a strong defensive game, but Watson finally penetrated with his rooks and Bob could not hold the position, ending up in a lost end game. So John captured First Prize Trophy and the \$158.00 cash.

Previously the CSCA Sponsored Tournament has been

held at the Sheraton Motor Inn, but this year CSCA Secretary Royal Franklin discovered that the Heart O' Denver would accommodate our Tournaments at a reasonable expense. Though the parking facilities are somewhat inadequate, the Heart O' Denver is more centrally located and the personnel are very helpful and responsible.

All in all, this year's Al Wallace was a successful tournament, facilities were convenient and barring the first round when the playing conditions were crowded and it was too warm (the air conditioning had not yet been turned on for Spring use) the general comments of the players were favorable.

A special thanks to the capable and highly efficient Rudy Ramsey for directing this year's Al Wallace, and thanks to all those people who helped at registration.. the tournament was both lively and exciting, so it was kind of surprising that no one streaked!

LOVELAND OPEN ATTRACTS FIELD OF 115

This year a new Tournament was added to the Colorado scene... Charles E. Moore of Loveland organized and directed the LOVELAND OPEN which attracted a field of 115 players (about 80 more than were expected). Despite the overflow of participants the tournament went fairly well, and Moore is optimistic about holding the event next year. The Tourney was played in one section with the first, fourth and fifth rounds being played at the Loveland Community Center, and the second and third rounds at the First National Bank and the Home State Bank. There were some exciting and unusual encounters, including Bob Shean's victory over Cory Boyd, Dave Jellison's win over Pat J. Mahoney in the last round and Richard Wittekind's (1625) "upset" draw with Robert Wendling (2205).

The 1st-2nd place winners were Dave Jellison and Bob Shean with 5-0 scores in an unbreakable tie. Their share of the cash prize was \$60 each. Third and fourth with 4 1/2-1/2 scores went to Robert Wendling and to William Frank... each winning \$10. The women's prize was split between Christine Hendrickson and Elizabeth Middleton with 2 1/2-2 1/2 scores. Class B 1st was won by Mark Lynn of Wyoming with a 4 1/2-1/2 score. The Class B 2nd was a four-way tie (4-1) between Sam Lindgren, Howard King, Glen Duer and Gottfried Kessler. Class C 1st went to Robert Brunkhurst (4-1). Second and third with 3 1/2-1 1/2 scores went to Joe Eversole and Calvin Hada. Fourth place with 3-2 was a ten-way tie between John Vernon, Robert Rose, Mohammed Qureshi, M. Van Wormer, Les Ward, Fred Gross, J. Smith, G. Layne, T. Huber and T. Sutton. Class D 1st, 2nd and 3rd, with 3-2 scores was won by G. Eichstedt, L. White, R. Canney, B. Height, J. Tretbar, R. Starrett. Class E 1st was won by William Prather with 2 1/2-2 1/2. Class E 2nd was a four-way tie between Don Parker, Mike Schwarz, J. Mathers and R. Moss. First Unrated was won by Patrick Ament 4-1. Second, third and fourth Unrated - Bob Adams, Paul Muma and John Stover with 3-2 scores.

The game evolved from a Pirc Defense setup, but the winning edge went to the Black Pieces due to his more active bishop and rooks. Both players ended up with 2 1/2-2 1/2 scores, and finished in about the middle of a 69 player Premier Section. Fairchild and Martin are both seen regularly at CSCA events.

COLORADANS AT NATIONAL

The 1974 National Open was held at the Stardust Hotel in Las Vegas, Nevada from March 17-22 with several Colorado Players not only participating but also showing that this state has its' share of highly competent players. Among Colorado Chess Players to distinguish themselves was Mike Dalesio who finished 5 1/2 2 1/2 and surprised International Master Celorio with his only defeat, Curtis Carlson who accepted a draw from Grandmaster Levante Lengyel of Hungary in what some assert was a winning position for Curtis and John Watson, now a Colorado Resident, who tied with 6 pts. for the Expert Prize along with Bill Abbott (Remember him?) now of Arizona. Bob Spears won the Premier Prize (1600-1799) with a 5-3 score. Bob Shean finished with a highly respectable 5 1/2-2 1/2 score and

in the process upset Master Victor Pupols of Seattle.

The winners of the Tournament were Arthur Bisguier, Ed. Celorio and Norman Weinstein with 7-1 scores. Bisguier won the 1st Place Trophy on tie-break. Walter Browne, the pre-tournament favorite to win, withdrew with 4 points after losing consecutively to Ruben Rodriguez and Paul Heinrich. In the Open Section 4th to 12 place went to John Grefe, Florin Gheorghiu, Peter Biyiasas, Ruben Rodriguez, Kenneth Frey, Roy Ervin, E. Martinovsky, Arnold Denker, John Jacobs. Some of our present senior members recall playing Alekhine, Capablanca and other greats of the early twenties and thirties. 


