


COLORADO OPEN HISTORY

by John A. Harris CSCA President 1969-1970 & 1971-1972

Prior to 1950, tournaments were very informally organized, with a notice on Denver's Central Branch YMCA bulletin board. In those earlier days, the Denver City Championship tournament was stronger in terms of playing strength than the state tournament, simply because of the mechanics: A city tournament, could be stretched out over a number of weeks, allowing the players to arrange their schedules to their own convenience; this arrangement did attract the best tournament players. For a state tournament on the other hand, in order to oblige the out-of-town participants, it was necessary to conduct the entire tournament on one or possible two weekends. Some strong city players did not want to meet that vigorous playing schedule, and did not compete. The Denver Chess Club was usually the host for those statewide tournaments, but other local organizations also hosted them from time to time. Originally, the state champion was decided in a "closed" tournament (only Colorado players were allowed to participate). Later, around 1952, an "open" system was used, in which national players were invited, and the Colorado player who achieved the highest tournament score became state champion.

In 1950 the first recorded Colorado State Chess Tournament (closed) was held in Denver at the Central branch YMCA, during the 4th of July weekend, under the sponsorship of the Denver Chess Club with Merl Reese as its Tournament Director. There were fifteen entries and Jack L. Hirsch was declared winner of the 5-round Swiss tournament with a $4\frac{1}{2} - \frac{1}{2}$ score. Jack at that time was a student of mathematics and psychology at Denver University. (Documentation: Article and picture in Chess Review, August, 1950 p.229)

The winner of the 1951 Colorado State Chess Tournament (closed) was Julius Partos. A game from the 1951 Colorado State Tournament was reported and analysed in Pawn Power in Chess by Hans Kmoch (McKay, 1959) p. 225 - 227, between Julius Partos and Virgil Harris (who won the Denver City Championship in 1952). The game is reported as a Major Benoni formation and is analyzed as such on pages 225 - 227. The following are the Colorado players who were declared State Chess Champions by virtue of receiving the highest score (of Colorado entrants) in the State Open Tournaments from 1950 - 1957.

1958 was a significant year for Colorado Chess, as it marked the formation of the Colorado State Chess Association and its affiliation with the United States Chess Federation. The Association began sponsoring USCF rated tournaments of which individual USCF memberships was a requirement in all sanctioned United States Chess Federation tournaments. The following is a list of winners who were declared Colorado State Chess Champions by virtue of receiving the highest score of Colorado entrants under USCF authorized approval.

CHESS NEWS FROM U.S.C.F.

KARPOV, KASPAROV AGAIN TOP WORLD RATING LIST

World Champion Anatoly Karpov and Grandmaster (GM) Gary Kasparov, both of the Soviet Union, again occupy the top two places on the semi-annual World Chess Federation rating list. Their respective ratings are, as they were on the January list, 2710 and 2690. (For comparison, former World Champion Bobby Fischer, now inactive for eleven years, is rated 2780.)

Other top players on the list, all GMs, include Ljubomir Ljubojevic of Yugoslavia (2645); Ulf Andersson of Sweden (2640); Robert Huebner of West Germany, Lev Polugaevsky, Mikhail Tal, and Rafael Vaganian, all Soviet Union (each 2620); Zoltan Ribli of Hungary (2615); and Viktor Korchnoi of Switzerland (2610).

Korchnoi, a two-time world championship challenger, will face Kasparov in a championship candidates semi-final match in Pasadena, California, starting July 30, while Ribli takes on former World Champion Vassily Smyslov of the Soviet Union (rated 2600) in the other semifinal. Vaganian made the biggest rating gain of any top player, gaining 70 points on the strength of a first at the Hastings International, a tie with Tal at the Tallinn International, and a tie for third in the powerful Soviet Championship.

Americans now hold 14 of the top 100 spots, up from 12 on the previous list. GM Yasser Seirawan of Seattle is top-ranked at 2605. Other leaders include GMs Lev Alburt of New York (2570), Walter Browne of Berkeley, Calif., and Lubomir Kavalek of Reston, Va. (each 2560). Strong gains were made by International Masters Nick de Firmian of Oakland, Calif. (45 points, now rated 2520) and Dmitry Gurevich of Brooklyn, N.Y. (40 points, now rated 2510).

Among women players, World Champion Maya Chiburdanidze of the Soviet Union leads with a 2390 rating, followed by Pia Cramling of Sweden and Nana Alexandria of the Soviet Union, each 2355. U.S. Champion Diane Savereide of Santa Monica, Calif., at 2150, easily tops the list of American women.

FIVE-WAY TIE AT WORLD OPEN

The eleventh annual World Open, with a prize fund of \$57,000, attracted a field of 839 players to New York City over July 4 weekend. The 349 player Open Section included nine Grandmasters (GMs) and 25 International Masters (IMs); the total of 113 masters was apparently a record for U.S. tournaments. Tying for first with 7-1 scores were GM Miguel Quinteros (Argentina) and IMs Leonid Bass (Milwaukee, Wisc.), Kamran Shirazi (Los Angeles), Kevin Spraggett (Canada), and Vitaly Zaltsman (Brooklyn).

Quinteros, Bass, and Shirazi have had previous major successes this year, and are among the leaders in the Church's Fried Chicken Grand Prix competition. Bass won the National Open, Quinteros tied for first in the \$24,000 Memorial Day Classic in Los Angeles, and Shirazi tied for first in both the Memorial Day Classic and the \$100,000 New York Open. Zaltsman's accomplishments include second place in the 1979 Grand Prix, participation in the 1980 U.S. Championship, and the 1982 championship of the strong Manhattan Chess Club. Spraggett is the second-highest rated player in Canada.

Tied for sixth through twelfth places were GMs Anatoly Lein (Union City, N.J.) and Jan Smejkal (Czechoslovakia), IMs Joel Benjamin (Brooklyn), John Fedorowicz (Clearwater, Fla.), and Michael Wilder (New Haven, Conn.), and Senior Masters Michael Brooks (Kansas City, Mo.) and Jacob

Yuchtman (New York). Benjamin started off with six straight wins, with his victims including IM Edward Formanek, GMs Lein and William Lombardy, and IM Eugene Meyer, before drawing with Quinteros and then losing to Bass in the final round. Others who contended for first until the end included GM Ron Henley (who lost to Quinteros) and James Tarjan (Zaltsman's victim) and IMs Maxim Dlugy (whom Shirazi beat) and Victor Frias (defeated by Spraggett).

The Open Section included nine of the 13 participants in this year's U.S. Championship (starting July 15 at Thiel College, Greenville, Pa.), including Tarjan, GM Lev Alburt, and Benjamin--currently the top three rated U.S. players. Also playing were six of the 10 players in the recent Junior Championship, and ten of the 12 players who will represent the U.S. in the World Youth Team Championship in Chicago, August 22-September 3.

Other major prize winners in the Open Section were: Doug Eckert, John Jarecki, Bill Mason, Askare Samimi, Macon Shibut, and David Tew (tied for Under 2200); Randall Hough, Calvin Marshall, Robert Muskath, Morris Needleman, and Issa Youssef (tied for Under 2100); and Tom Brookshear, Steve Goldstein, and James Salmon (tied for Under 2000).

Winners in the lower sections included: Vidyadher Kachroo, Victor Montilla, and Zachary Perry (Group 2--Under 2000); Benoit Alain and Thomas Balla (Group 3--Under 1900); Francois Perent (Group 4--Under 1800); Bryan Ball and Leo Tuin (Group 5--Under 1700); John Suggs (Group 6--Under 1600); and in Group 7, Edward Deering (Under 1500), Robert Ehrenworth (Under 1400), Michael Kertes (Under 1300), and John Bean and Rudolph Lobou (Under 1200).

Bill Goichberg directed for the sponsoring Continental Chess Association, assisted by Alan Benjamin, Jerome Bibuld, Jess Goodman, Martin Jacowitz, Carol Jarecki, Mark Levine, and Ira Riddle.

SPECTATING THE 1983 U.S. CHAMPIONSHIP

As announced previously, the 1983 U.S. Chess Championship will be starting July 14, at Thiel College, Greenville, Pennsylvania. The final details have been wrapped up, and the stage is set for a fascinating battle among 14 of the nation's top players: Grandmasters Lev Alburt, Walter Browne, Larry Christiansen, Roman Dzindzichashvili, Anatoly Lein, Andrew Soltis, and James Tarjan; International Masters Joel Benjamin, Nick de Firmian, Dmitry Gurevich, Boris Kogan, Sergey Kudrin, and Kamran Shirazi; and Senior Master Jay Whitehead.

For chess fans able to attend, options include dormitory rooms and meals, individually and in attractive package plans. There are also a number of motels and restaurants in the immediate area. Admission is \$4 per round, with rounds scheduled for 1 PM on July 15-17, 19-21,

23-25, 27-29, and 31. Further details can be obtained from U.S. Chess or from Thiel College's Center for Lifelong Learning, (412)-588-3308.

Those who cannot watch may wish to follow the play through the round-by-round bulletins. Available from the Center for Lifelong Learning, Thiel College, Greenville, Penn., 16125, for only \$7, the bulletins will be mailed first-class to subscribers after Round 6 and immediately after the tournament.

Chief Director Richard Verber and his assistant Walter Brown look forward to a smooth-running and exciting tournament, with chess fans across the U.S. eagerly following the results.

PERGAMON PRESS TO SPONSOR U.S. OPEN SPEED CHESS CHAMPIONSHIP

Pergamon Press of Elmsford, N.Y. and Oxford, England has announced that it will again sponsor the U.S. Open Speed Championship. The event will be held in conjunction with the U.S. Open Championship at the Huntington Sheraton Hotel in Pasadena, Calif. on Saturday, August 13, which is a "free day" in the middle of the Open Championship.

The tournament will consist of a number of preliminary sections, with top finishers qualifying for the finals, which will offer \$800 in prizes--first \$450, second \$200, third \$100, and fourth \$50. Pergamon Press is donating \$1,000 worth of books; winners will include finalists as well as top preliminary finishers who fail to qualify for the finals.

Registration will be from 6:45--7:30 p.m., with the tournament starting at 8:00. U.S. Open Tournament Director Ben Nethercot and his staff will direct. Last year's winner was Senior Master Joe Bradford of Austin, Texas.

Pergamon Press is a leading publisher of chess books. From Tim Redman, USCF President, on Kasparov-Korchnoi Match

This is to update you regarding the match between Viktor Korchnoi (Switzerland) and Gary Kasparov (USSR), scheduled to begin July 29 in Pasadena, California. As you may have seen in The New York Times, Tass released word of an official protest by the Soviet Chess Federation that objected to the choice of Pasadena and Abu Dhabi, United Arab Emirates, as sites for the Kasparov-Korchnoi and Ribli-Smyslov World Championship Candidates' Semifinal Matches.

The Soviet protest was dated June 26. It appeared in The New York Times on June 28, next to Robert Byrne's column. On June 27 FIDE President Florencio Campomanes responded with the strong statement: "The regulations do provide appropriate consequences for the non-appearance of a participant on the scheduled date."

The regulations state that non-appearance means match forfeit. They do provide, however, that each player has the right to one postponement.

The Soviet protest was based on the position that the match site should be decided primarily on the basis of agreement between the two players, although they also had doubts about a U.S. site, calling it unfavorable.

On June 29, I cabled to Vitaly Sevastianov, my counterpart in the Soviet Union: "Puzzled over June 27 USSR protest released by Tass. Many thousands of American Kasparov enthusiasts eagerly await Pasadena match. Hope you can help. Regards."

On July 12, in an interview for Pravda, World Champion Anatoly Karpov called for an end to the dispute over the site of the Candidates' Semifinal Match, and stated that he expected Gary Kasparov to emerge as his official challenger (UPI PM--Karpov, July 12 #0262).

Nick Paleveda - Igor Ivanov, Boulder Open 1983, Rd. 2. SICILIAN COUNTER ATTACK (E55/b)

The SCA, long condemned as incorrect and useful primarily for surprise value, has recently been the subject of new analysis which has turned it into a deadly tournament weapon. Praxis in world class events has been favorable; the five examples given in Informants 32 and 33 resulted in 3½ points for Black. OFFICIAL NOTICE OF PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO CSCA BYLAWS

Your board of directors is recommending several specific changes to CSCA bylaws. The bylaws state that amendments require a 2/3 vote of the members voting at a meeting of the membership. Notification of these proposed amendments must be sent to the membership in advance. This publication constitutes the required advance notice.

The proposed amendments are as follows:

1. Moved that Article III, paragraph 1, first sentence be amended from "Association dues shall be \$8.00 for one year," to "Association dues shall be \$10.00 for one year." (The board feels that this will provide use with funds to produce the CCI since we have lacked the volunteer manpower to publish regularly.)

2. Moved that Article III, paragraph 1, third sentence (added in 1981) be amended from "A non-voting single tournament membership is

available at a cost of \$2.00 ..." to "A non-voting single tournament membership is available at a cost of \$3.00 ..." (Reasoning is as stated from proposing amendment #1.)

3. Moved that Article III, paragraph 1, be amended by adding the following sentence after the third sentence: "A participating Junior membership is available to those Juniors whose parent is a full member at a cost of \$1.50." (This is to encourage parents to get their children to join us and to play chess. No CCI or newsletter would normally go out to the participating junior.)

4. Moved that Article III, paragraph 1, be amended by adding the following sentence before the last sentence: "A patron membership is available for \$25.00 or \$50.00." (Perks for this membership is a)publication of the purchase of the patron membership, b)waiving of all late entry fees, and c)for the \$50 memberships, delivery of CCI and newsletter by first class mail.)
