

- I. The meeting was called to order at 2:30 pm by President Mark Ludwig.
- II. The minutes of last year's meeting were read and accepted.
- III. Reports of the Board Members
  - A. President's Message: We have achieved regularity in the publication of our Colorado Chess Informant and newsletters. For this next year we will attempt to become more business-like in our record keeping and related activities. We are also looking for volunteers to serve on Scholastic and Publicity committees, two areas in which we hope to expand during this next year.
  - B. As the Junior Representative was absent, Alexander Fishbein presented the Scholastic report. It was a successful year for scholastic chess and it is hoped that this success will continue next year.
  - C. Delegate's Report. Mark Ludwig gave a report on decisions and activities of the USCF. Colorado gained an additional voting member to correspond with the increase in membership. CSCA received from USCF a check for \$256.50 from the SASP funds. The board of CSCA had notified USCF that it will spend the funds in two areas: \$140.00 is earmarked for the purchase of 40 USCF Participating Junior memberships for current scholastic members of CSCA. The remaining \$116.50 is to be added to the prize fund the the Colorado Chess Tour.
  - D. Randy Siebert gave the Treasurer's Report. In comparison with last year's financial situation, CSCA has had a net gain of \$96.67. The Treasurer's report was passed and accepted by the membership.
- IV. Committee Reports
  - A. Prison Chess - Report by Chris Hendrickson  
The maximum security project is almost completed. Dave Jellison gave a siml demonstration there. The medium security project has been started. L.R. Moore is attempting to organize the First World Postal Prison Championship.
  - B. Scholastic Committee - Charles Moore and Buck Buchanan volunteered to serve on the Scholastic committee along with the current members Mike Zak and Alexander Fishbein. It was noted that USCF intends to publish a guide for scholastic tournaments.
  - C. Publicity Committee. Mark Ludwig has put together a list of radio stations as a possible contact list. Robert Holland noted that grocery stores offer free publicity for non-profit groups on their bags and receipt tapes. Mark Wood is attempting to expand the Chess Hotline tape and is looking for chess related information to put on it. A publicity committee was formed, consisting of Bill Hall, Bill Jeavons, Jay Salam and Robert Holland. Jay Salam was elected chairman.
  - D. Tournament Planning.  
It was noted that there is no CSCA involvement in the U.S. Closed Championship being held in Estes Park.  
A desire to expand the Colorado Tour to include events in the Western Slope and Southern Colorado.  
A straw poll was conducted among the members present: 15 people indicated that they would be willing to make a donation to aid CSCA's attempt to bring the 1986 U.S. Class Championship to Colorado; 20 people indicated that they would be willing to pay a \$50.00 entry fee to play in the event.


## THE 1985 U.S. OPEN

by Alex Fishbein

This August I competed in the U.S. Open Chess Championship and was also Colorado's representative in the inaugural U.S. High School Tournament of State Champions. The latter was held August 5-11; the rounds were in the mornings. I was clear first in the high school tournament, defeating USCF masters Danny Edelman of New York, Ron Burnett of Tennessee, and Adam Lief of California along the way.

The following game was played in the last round of the high school tournament. I had 4½ points out of 5 and my opponent had 4.

Turning to the U.S. Open: The 12-round, one section tournament had a good Colorado representation: Andrew Rea, John Howell, Richard Vidmar, Mike Zak, Mark Ludwig, and myself. I scored 8½ points, far behind the three-way tie for first between World Championship Challenger Yasser Seirawan, International Master Joel Benjamin, and former World Champion Boris Spassky (10 points each). Seirawan won the trophy on tiebreak.

In round 10 of the U.S. Open I was paired against GM Robert Byrne, who obviously wanted to get his revenge for the loss to me in the first round of the 1985 New York International. This is what happened:

However, 10...Qd7 is the book move. Its idea is that Black will play ...h6 and only after White's Bh4 will ...Be7 be played. I chose 10...Be7 immediately because in this particular variation it is not yet clear where Black's queen belongs.) Be7; 11 B:e7, N:e7; 12 Bc2 (White could have tried 12 Nd4, but it seems that Black can play 12...N:b3; 13 N:b3, Nf5; 14 Nc5, Qe7; 15 b4, 0-0 and Black's weakness of c5 is compensated by possibilities of ...a5, ...d4, and perhaps ...f6. This variation speaks volumes about positional chess. Although White assumes control of one important square in the position, he loses control of others. White's position is not yet good enough for him to be able to make such a favorable strategical transformation so easily.) Bf5 (This move will improve my position because it exchanges my inactive bishop.) 13 Nd4?! (After this move Black will have no problems at all. White's last try for an advantage was 13 B:f5, N:f5; 14 Nd4, but after 14...N:d4; 15 cd, Ne6 Black's position is satisfactory.) B:c2; 14 Q:c2, Ne6 (Black has accomplished almost everything and now threatens to play 15...c5. White's next attempt to claim an advantage is bound to fail.) 15 f4, c5 16 f5, cd; 17 fe, fe; 18 cd, Qb6 (Suddenly White has some problems, as 19 Qf2 fails to 19...Nf5!; 20 g4, N:d4; 21 Qf7+, Kd8 or 21 Rd1, Ne2+. Byrne chooses to sacrifice material.) 19 Nc3, Q:d4+; 20 Kh1, g6! (In order to play 21...Rf8) 21 Rad1, Q:e5; 22 Rfe1 (Not 22 Rde1, Qd6; 23 Rf6, Rf8!) Qf6; 23 Rf1, Qe5; 24 Rfe1, Qf6 (If 24...Qf5, then 25 Qe2! 0-0; 26 Q:e6+, Q:e6; 27 R:e6 and White should be able to regain the pawn and hold a draw.) 25 Rf1 and the game was drawn by three-time repetition of the position after 25...Qe5; ½-½.

No doubt Colorado will have a worthy champion next year to defend its High School Tournament of Champions title!

#### NORTH AMERICAN COMPUTER CHESS CHAMPIONSHIP

THE Sixteenth North American Computer Chess Championship will be held October 13th through 15th, 1985 at the Denver Raddison Hotel. The tournament will be held in conjunction with the Association for Computing Machinery (ACM) Annual Conference. A four-round Swiss-style tournament is planned, with the best programs in the world expected to compete. Round times are Sunday October 13 at 1:00 p.m. and 7:30 p.m., Monday October 14 at 7:30 p.m., and Tuesday October 15 at 7:30 p.m.

CRAY BLITZ (Robert Hyatt, Burt Gower, and Harry Nelson), current world computer chess champion and winner of ACM's 1984 tournament, is expected to defend its title against BELLE (Ken Thompson, Joe Condon), former world champion, and NUCHESS (David Slate, William Blanchard), a descendant of CHESS 4.6. BELLE was awarded the Master's title by the USCF in 1983.

A special Turing Test is planned at 7:30 Monday afternoon, October 14. A leading human player will play a simultaneous match against several opponents, some of them humans and some computers. Neither this player nor the audience see the opponents but will be asked to guess which are humans and which are computers.

Mike Valvo, one of America's leading blindfold players, will serve as tournament director. Rounds are scheduled as follows: Sunday at 1:00 pm and 7:30 pm, Monday at 7:30 pm, and Tuesday at 7:30 pm. Spectator's fees are \$5 for each days' chess events, or \$10 for all three days.

Technical sessions on computer chess are also planned as part of the ACM Conference on Tuesday afternoon, October 15. These consist of a Panel Session titled, "Chess Programs: From Basement to Marketplace", and a Papers Session in which three technical presentations are given. Entry to these sessions is not included in the computer chess spectator's fees.

Tournament organizers are looking for volunteers to help with the overhead projectors for the Turing Test and the Chess Tournament and it is hoped that volunteers rated 1600 and above can be found. Winning this tournament raised Alex Fishbein's rating from 2398 to 2409, making him the Rocky Mountain area's only Senior Master. Congratulations, Alex!!




