
COLORADO OPEN

Alexander Fishbein is once again the Colorado State Chess Champion. Outclassing the field with a 2568 rating, Alex gave up a draw to the unconquerable Mark Wood but defeated masters Quintanar, Poynton, and Jellison to finish a full point ahead of the field. His first prize, enriched by a generous anonymous donation, amounted to \$700.

75 players participated in the two sections of the 3-day event. Some came from as far away as Utah, South Dakota, and New Mexico. One remarkable player was Curtis Cooper of New Mexico, ten years of age. After a slow start, Curtis started to mop up Class A players and finally finished in the money with 3½ points. Some of his games are published in this issue; it is hard to believe a 10-year-old could produce such tough, mature fighting chess. Here is definitely a young man to watch.

First place in the Reserve Section went to James Burden and Robert Overdorff, who each scored 5-1. Paul Connors won the "Best Combination" prize for his miniature against Garth Courtois.

The annual CSCA membership meeting was held during the tournament, with most of the excitement centering around the elections. The new CSCA Board is as listed on the inside front cover of this issue.





Sir:

I was particularly gratified to read National Master David Jellison's column in the July issue, and I would like to express an agreement and a disagreement with 2 issues he raised. (I am a weaker player who will die happy if I ever make it above 1600, so you can consider this a low-ranked player's view.)

I'm not a speedy player, and I agree with Mr. Jellison in protesting fast time-controls. I don't want to risk my rating points on a time-pressure-induced blunder either. I have avoided, and will continue to avoid, playing in any sudden-death tournaments. If enough players find these time controls objectionable, reduced participation will cause these quickies to crumble.

I am aware of the tremendous time-investment a really strong player must make - I am lucky if I can study 6 hours a week - but I am not disturbed that a class C prize is the same as that of Candidate Master. Surely the much more numerous lower-rated players pay the bulk of entry fees; I think we are entitled to a comparable return in prize money. Master play is a high art demanding great talent, and I willingly support it, but not to the extent of the distribution suggested by Mr. Jellison.

I won't enter a tournament with no class prizes. I have little chance of winning any money, but the possibility keeps me going, just like a lottery player. If the probability is zero, so is my participation.



ACTION CHESS - THUMBS UP!

On issues ranging from corporate sponsorship to the disintegration and immorality of chess itself, Action Chess [Game/30] has ignited a controversial debate not seen in chess circles since the introduction of algebraic notation.

There is no question that the dubious distinction of being a professional chess player would not be enhanced by additional corporate funding. Our top Grand Masters earn less than 1/10 the earnings of other sports competitors. Chess more than anything else is a game requiring the competitive spirit, and G/30 is the epitome of a no guts no glory format. If we treat chess as a competitive sport and give up our elitism of being brainy loners or creators of an abstract art form we may yet reap the benefits.

The key to corporate sponsorship is spectators. Champion Spark Plugs does not advertise on the side of Formula 1 racing cars so that the drivers have something to read. It is there for the spectators. Action Chess, in which the game must be completed within one hour, is not sedate, it is not for the overly sensitive, it is designed for the competitor who prefers blood & rating points. It is exactly that mental drive which can compare to the visions of sweat, muscle, and rigorous exercise in other competitions which offer the proverbial carrot to the media.

From a director's point of view G/30 is like a dream come true. The individual round times including the conclusion of the tournament is clearly known prior to registration. Chess clubs with limited playing space can hold larger events by staggering rounds between sections.

The most critical factor in regard to the outcome of G/30 on the chess community as a whole is how the ratings will be structured. If the USCF creates multiple rating systems we will dissect the chess community. Can you picture a chess player entering a local tournament and trying to decide what rating to use. He will now have a Classic rating, an Action rating, a Blitz rating, a FIDE rating and a Postal rating. Will the USCF who seems to have their hands full now dealing with only one rating be able to handle multiple ratings without an increase in overhead and a loss of efficiency. If the USCF ignores the situation for too long a period of time the private organizations like Inside Chess and Blitz Chess will be forced to take over the rating game. A player who participates only on Friday night at a local G/30 tournament will not have to be a member of USCF because Inside Chess is handling and publishing the Action ratings. Suddenly, the chess community is dissected into factions.

We must stay united as a whole. If chessplayers are so afraid of losing rating points because of the fast time control the answer is in a simple cliché. If you can not stand the heat then stay out of the Kitchen. G/30 is only a tournament format, it is not intended to replace the championship cycle nor events of longer time controls. As to the notion that GM titles will be given away for a song. The answer to this is simple. Do not give titles for Action play. If G/30 becomes as popular as this author thinks it will, titles will not be necessary; we will be giving away plenty of money.
