(EDITOR'S NOTE: Due to circumstances beyond my control, I only received copies of about half the games played in this tournament. The games below are selected from those that I have. If I get the remaining games, I will publish a selection next issue. I am sorry about the lack of continuity, but, alas, there is nothing that can be done about it.)

March madness is synonymous with NCAA basketball tournament time. In Colorado it also means it is time for the Colorado Closed. This year's edition was held over the weekends of March 25-26 and April 1-2. The tournament was won by Dave Jellison with Sam Quintanar and Ray Haskins taking second.

The Closed is one of the few Colorado tournaments to employ the round-robin format. It is a source of fascination to me to watch players raised on action chess and the cut and thrust of weekend Swisses adapt to the different style required in a round-robin. In some cases the players can not make this adaptation.

This year's tournament sported an average rating of 2185. As such, it was the weakest Closed so far (if 2185 can be considered weak!). However, the Closed ran true to form with the highest rated player blitzing the field. As with Alex Fishbe and Randy Canney, Dave Jellison had first place salted away before the last round.

Round One produced two upsets as Bardwick demolished Quintanar and Case outdueled Hamblin in a bishops of opposite colors ending. Jellison wore down Karasik in a rook ending, while Haskins won a tough double-edged struggle against Hammersmith.

Round Two opened with Bardwick losing to Hammersmith. Jellison and Hamblin agreed to a "fatigue" draw in a position perhaps favoring Hamblin. After gaining a considerable advantage against Karasik, Haskins failed to follow up properly and allowed a draw. Karasik admitted he was ready to resign on move fifteen. Quintanar gained a space advantage and in a superior knight vs. bishop ending and squeezed Case for the win. Ken may have had defensive chances, but such positions are unpleasant to defend.



The second day of play began with Hammersmith and Quintanar splitting the point in a king and pawn ending not devoid of complications. After a see-saw battle Bardwick committed the last error, allowing Karasik to score the point. Despite severe time trouble Haskins made his extra pawn tell against Hamblin. This game was awarded the best game prize. Jellison won another tough game against Case.

The fourth round opened with Bardwick blundering against Hamblin, allowing the latter a nine-move win. Hamblin showed gross disrespect for the round-robin format by playing the Latvian Gambit. Case and Haskins split the point despite Haskins' chronic time trouble. Hammersmith let slip a big advantage and had to fight for a draw. Quintanar-Jellison had more twists and turns than an Agatha Christie detective novel. Dave was busted and in time trouble after ten moves, but Sam could not put him away and in a wild double time scramble Dave gained an advantage and the point.

This round marked the start of the final weekend. Ray Haskins faced a real challenge, having to play Jellison and Quintanar with Black. Unfortunately, it turned out to be a lost weekend for Ray.

The round started with Karasik and Quintanar playing to a draw in a position which held promise for Karasik. Hammersmith crunched Hamblin, while Case and Bardwick battled to an arduous draw. The key game of the round and the tournament was Jellison-Haskins. Ray let slip a very playable position while in time trouble, giving Dave the win and the tournament.

#### OBSERVATIONS

Dave seemed more focussed and directed this tournament than in others. He played very well and benefitted from that dash of luck that winners often receive. For Dave's last tournament in Colorado, he could not have had a better result.

Haskins played very well but suffered from his inability to avoid getting into time trouble. Sam started slowly but really played good aggressive chess the last weekend. He seemed to adapt to the format as time went on.

Vladimir learned a great deal from playing competition of this level. He made some mistakes but showed great fighting spirit and resourcefulness. Many new players may not know Jim Hammersmith, though he has played in Colorado for many years. He is a solid player and this result is no surprise. Ken Case also played his usual brand of solid chess but seemed to suffer from fatigue as the tournament wore on. Jim Hamblin's result was not what could be expected from a player of his caliber, yet he always managed to play the most interesting chess. Alan Bardwick admitted a certain lack of patience with the format. Still, he achieved enough good positions to show that he belonged in the tournament.

To hold a successful tournament you need the help of many people, all of whom deserve thanks. First and foremost, I thank the players, for without them there would be no tournament. I am indebted to CSCA for providing their support and the best game prize. Mark and Liz Wood did great work in untangling scoresheets to provide scores for this report. And lastly I thank my dear wife Debbie, who understands because she is a chessplayer.

### BROTHERS 3 RRRR's

The Brothers Three Railroad Round Robins were organized by the players themselves and played (mostly) at the Brothers Three Bar and Grill, which is located in three railroad cars beside the main track in Louisville. The players all wish to express their appreciation to the Engles family for the free use of their restaurant as a playing site; to Liz Wood, who served as volunteer chief tournament director; and to Michael Engles, who stayed late to lock up the restaurant on a number of occasions when the games extended beyond the usual business hours.

The idea for these tournaments got its start last winter when Michael Engles contacted a couple of players about the possibility of playing some match games at the restaurant during the evening hours. From there it grew into the plan for a small round robin among a group of friends who had met through various chess activities (at weekend tournaments, chess clubs, etc.). Nearly all of the important decisions were made collectively after discussion by the players.

From the beginning there seemed to be a clear consensus that the players wanted an opportunity to play rated chess games on week nights at the traditional tournament time control (40/2), and moreover that the players wanted a low entry fee and a flat prize distribution. The philosophy behind these tournaments was that the games would be primarily for fun and self-improvement. In the first tournament three equal prizes were offered--first place and two class prizes (U1550 and U1400). In the second tournament first- and second-place prizes were offered in each section, with first worth half again as much as second.

U. S. AMATEUR CHAMPIONSHIPS

The U.S. Amateur Championships (West) were held this year at Snowbird Resort near Salt Lake City on May 27-29. The rugged setting was ideal and produced competitive fighting chess in the battles for the trophies and prestige. In the Open section the races for overall and class prizes were all close. Despite being paired up by an average of nearly 200 points in 5 out of 6 rounds, I managed to finish with 3 $\frac{1}{2}$  points. I needed both of my wins on the final day to give me clear first among the Class B players. Two of my games follow, including one that I believe was the shortest of the tournament.

ASSOCIATION OF COLLEGE UNIONS (ACUI) REGION XIII CHESS TOURNAMENT

On February 24-25, the college Region XIII recreation tournament was held at the Colorado State University in Fort Collins. ACUI Region XIII encompasses five states: Arizona, New Mexico, Utah, Wyoming, and Colorado. Many recreational tournaments are held, including chess. Normally chess does not bring a good crowd, but this year's entrants included 16 players from 7 schools, representing all five states. There were five players rated over 2000 (with two masters), which was unusually strong. A five round Swiss was played, and competition was for individual and 2-player team prizes. Competition was intense, and scores were very close. It should be noted that this tournament was a gentlemen's event - a smooth-running, problem-free event.


In the individual competition, Andrew Koines (2256) from the University of Arizona took first place with  $4\frac{1}{2}$  points. Second place went to Fletcher Baragar (2389) from the University of Utah. In the team competition, the University of Utah took first place with  $6\frac{1}{2}$  points out of a possible 10. This seems like a low number for a first place team, but, as I mentioned earlier, this was a tight tournament. Second place went to our own Air Force Academy with  $5\frac{1}{2}$  points. The cadets seemed to play a lot better than their ratings indicated. Considering they were without their top three players, a second place finish with two freshmen wasn't bad. It seems as though college chess is on the rise in our area, and I hope it continues with strong college chess clubs. Hopefully all schools will be able to field teams at next year's event at the University of Arizona.
