## FOLKS WE KNOW

Colorado's Vladimir Karasik tied for second place in the annual Arnold Denker Tournament of High School Champions held along with the U.S. Open in Chicago. Vlad scored 4-1, half a point behind Jessee Kraai of New Mexico. He also played in the Open and scored a strong 6-3. Congratulations to Vlad and Jessee.

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Ex-Coloradan Andy Rea, now stationed in Germany, writes of his European exploits in EN PASSANT, the journal of the Pittsburgh Chess Club. Among other experiences, he served as team trainer for the US Virgin Islands team in the Thessaloniki Olympiad.

In the April issue of the COLORADO CHESS INFORMANT, I mentioned that playing a tournament in the Soviet Union was my dream. Well, with help from some generous Colorado players and organizers, this dream was realized this summer. I went to Moscow to participate in the World Cup Qualifier. The trip was sponsored by Walter Gerash, aided by donations from Stanley Hotel owner Frank Normali and many local chessplayers. It would be impossible to mention all of them and unfair to mention a few. But thanks to Tony Wilson and Mark Kriseler, who organized simuls for me at the Boulder and Lakewood clubs, respectively.

Now, finally, on to the results. I won't try to be half-hearted about this - the World Cup Open, a great learning experience for me, was disappointing - at the time it seemed disastrous. And the result certainly was - a miserable 2½ out of 9.

It was a story of missed opportunities, caused by an overconfident approach. It seemed that I expected my opponents to make mistakes.

But luck alone can not possibly explain such a bad result - but it was a factor. But, paradoxically, this was just as well. Only the faults of my style were apparent, but that made it possible for me to single them out. And, as a result, I am a much better chessplayer.

Now I will illustrate all of this.

Against a young Soviet master, I played very well and reached the position to the right. It is hard to believe how I could lose this. But watch.



It turned out that this was just the beginning. But that was also a blessing in disguise. After the World Cup I was invited to play in a category 11 (close to US Championship standard) international round-robin tournament, also in Moscow, five days after the last round of the "main event." This was a wonderful opportunity for me - tournaments like this do not exist in the United States.

The Soviet organizers felt that I was overrated (My FIDE rating was 2490.) and this would make it easier for Soviet players in the round-robin to earn GM and IM norms. And in the beginning it looked as though they were right. I lost the first three games of this event. The following illustrates my difficulty in concentrating.

The failure to play the obvious in-between move 23 b3 indicated that my concentration was absent. It was only now that I realized what the source of my trouble was - 12 games too late, 8 losses too late, but not too late to start playing good chess. Before defeating an opponent, I had to defeat myself: to get rid of the subconscious desire to play obvious moves and win the game as soon as possible. Every game would be a tough fight.

Of the next 7 games, I scored  $4\frac{1}{2}$  points. This was 5 draws and 2 wins against 5 GM's (4 of them Soviet), an IM, and an FM. Both of my victories were against GM's - D. Campora (Argentina) and V. Chekhov (USSR). And, although a loss in the last round to IM Alexey Vuzhmanavin (USSR) cast a damper, I was happy with my play. The following was my first victory over a GM with the Black pieces.

A crazy game, which I invite the reader to analyze. It shows that I was capable of a decent effort.

Upon my return to the US, the improvement in my results was quickly apparent. At the World Open in Philadelphia I scored 7 out of 10 against 6 strong GM's, one 2500, two 2300's, and one expert. I was 3-3 versus the GM's (M. Gurevich (USSR), L. Psakhis (USSR), M. Dlugy, J. Benjamin, W. Browne, N. DeFirmian).

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



My result in the World Open was my best performance ever. It gives me confidence  
 that I am a much stronger player after my trip to Moscow.

Further compelling evidence of the incredible lack of US women players came this summer when US Chess was reduced to inviting such patzers as myself to the 1989 Women's Championship, held July 6-16 in Spartanburg, South Carolina.

It was 8 AM on Friday, June 16, when the phone rang. "This is Bob Nasiff of US Chess. Would you be interested in the Women's Championship?" What kind of a joke is this? Those guys at the chess club have a pretty weird sense of humor. But I played along.

"Sure, but a fish like me would hardly qualify."

"Guess again!"

Could that many of the top players actually have declined the invitation? So it would seem. Most every one of the highest rated players had better things to do. The top player to accept was Liz Neely, barely a master at 2205. This thing was wide open. Anyone would win. Even me?!

There was no time to prepare. The tournament started in two weeks. Should I cram desperately? Would it help? Or should I just party nonstop until the plane left? Would it hurt? Those who know me have already figured out which option I selected.

So there I was, dazed and confused in this one-horse airport in South Carolina, clutching my identifying chessboard.

The organizers, members of Spartanburg's chess club, went all out for us and created playing conditions superior to any I've ever seen. According to Larry Christiansen, the conditions were better than those at the Interzonal. Grandmaster Christiansen was there as Natasha Us' second. Everyone had trainers except Alexey Rudolph, Diana Gerge, and me.

Alexey won the tournament. She rode on a wave of exhilaration anyway, anticipating her approaching marriage to Doug Root on August 6. All the players were wonderfully friendly and cooperative, and most had lots of great chess lore to share.

About the wildest happening was the great Ruth Donnelly sex fiend expose. Now Ruth is a kindly, quiet lady, who came with her husband who is also very nice. They were staying in a separate building with better amenities. At the same time, there was a basketball camp at the college, and about 50,000 hyperactive young boys were staying in the same building as Ruth.

One night around midnight Ruth was wandering the halls in her robe. She didn't know about all the young boys now sharing the building. The kids' chaperone didn't know about Ruth. 


Although I had lots of opportunities in the rest of the games, I managed to blow them all, usually in moderate to severe time pressure. In the last round, for example, against Sharon Burtman, I kept seeing incredible queen sacs. There was usually a good reply to them, but one led to a tricky draw. Oddly enough, I had seen the whole continuation on this move until I really had an opportunity to play it, at which time I promptly forgot the decisive check. Well...that's chess.

I could have got  $5\frac{1}{2}$  points if the luck winds had been blowing my way. Ah, if only! Six points supposedly got a WIM title in this zonal tournament. As US Women's Champion, Alexey Rudolph (now Root) will advance to the Women's World Championship. Good luck, Alexey!
