The Post-Mortem

Slaying the Giant

by Eric S. Perlman

Beating someone rated way above you is always a thrill. However, there is no secret to accomplishing this feat - just plenty of good, hard work. As Dr. Saveilly Tartakower said, "The winner is he who makes the last mistake but one."

In both of this issue's games, a lower-ranked player defeats one of the state's best. It very often happens that such clashes, when they result in upsets, produce the best games, and these are no exception.

Sicilian Defense

St. Patrick's Day Open, Denver, 1991

1.e4 c5 2.Nf3 d6 3.d4 cxd4 4.Nxd4 Nf6 5.Nc3 a6 6.f4

This counter (as against the more common 6.Be2 and 6.Bg5) aims for Kingside play based on possession of the f-file, if Black plays 6...e5.

6...e6

Black instead chooses to transpose to the Scheveningen system, perhaps the most common. One interesting alternative, which I have occasionally tried, is 6...Qc7 7.Bd3 (7.Be2 e5 - 7...g6 8.g4!? h6 (8...Bg7 9.g5 Nfd7 10.Nd5 Qd8 11.Be3±, Sokolov-Chandler, Leningrad 1987) 9.Bf3 Nc6 10.Nb3 Bg7 11.Be3 unclear, Dolmatov-Lutikov, 1978 - is like a main line Najdorf in many ways) 7...g6 8.O-O Bg7 9.Nf3 Nbd7 10. Qe1 b5!?, with a very complex game, as in Janosevic-Stean, Lone Pine 1978. 7.a4 Be7 8.Be2 O-O 9.O-O Bd7

More usual is 9...Nc6 first, then ...Qc7, and only then ...Bd7. Playing thus limits Black's choices, as we shall see. Examples of 9...Nc6 can be quoted ad nauseam, but an interesting new one was Dolmatov-Stohl, Manila Interzonal 1990: 9...Nc6 10.Be3 Qc7 11.Kh1 Re8 12.Bf3 Na5 13.Qe1 Nc4 14.Be1 e5 15.Nde2 d5!? 16.exd5 Bd6! (also 16...Bf5 is fine, but this is even better, according to Stohl) 17.fxe5 and now 17...Nxe5! 18.Bf4 Nxf3 would give equality, according to Stohl's analysis in the tournament book. Instead, 17...Bxe5?! 18.Qh4 Bf5 19.Nd4 Bg6 was played, giving White a chance to play 20.Nc6!±, a chance Dolmatov did not choose to take.

10.Kh1 Nc6 11.Be3

The most direct. White might instead try to take advantage of Black's unusual move order and transpose into the Maroczy system, which entails Nb3, a5, and postponing the dark-squared bishop's development until its best square is clear, with 11.Nb3 (against which the best systems put off ...Bd7 for quite a while, i.e. going back a couple of moves, 9...Qc7 10.Kh1 Nc6 11.Nb3 b6 12.Bf3 Rd8 13.Qe1 Rab8 14.Be3 Na5! when Black has a promising game, Foltys-Benko, 1948).

11...Qc7

Black has now transposed into one of the most popular lines, but without the usual choice of paths (if he had chosen first ...Qc7 he might have chosen the more popular 11...Re8 or 11...Rd8 lines).

12.Qe1

Kasparov and Nikitin give instead 12.Nb3 b6 13.Bf3 Rb8 14.Qe2 Na5, Vogt-Schmidt, 1976, similar to the note after White's 11th. White instead chooses to follow the path taken in Sznepik-Stempin, Poland 1985.

12...Rfe8 13.Qg3 (Diagram 1) d5

This was also Stempin's choice; his game continued 14.Nxc6 Bxc6 15.e5, when BCO 2 gives White a slight edge. The move itself is superficially attractive, as the old adage for the Sicilian prescribes that whenever Black can get in ...d5, he's equalized. But like all advice, that must be taken with a grain of salt. In both Sznepik-Stempin and the present game, White proves that the restriction gained through e5 is too much, and so the time must not be deemed ripe. More appropriate may be 13...e5, a la the "Modern Scheveningen" lines (14.Nf5 Bxf5 15.exf5 Re8 followed by Bf8 with good play).

14.Bd3 Bc5

Now that we are on uncharted ground, Black also had to look at 14...dxe4, trying to avoid the bind after a future e5 (note that 14.e5 would have been too early due to 14...Ne4!). Then 15.Nxe4 Nb4 would attempt to neutralize the strong Bd3; however, I believe White gets the edge after 16.Qh3 (the threat is now Nxf6+ and Qxh7+) Nxd3 17.cxd3 e5 18.Nf5 Nxe4 (18...Rc8 19.Rc1 Qb8 20.fxe5 Qxe5 21.Nxe7+ Qxe7 22.Nxf6+ gxf6 23.Rxc8 Rxc8 24.Bd4 with an edge) 19.dxe4. The opening of lines favors White's active pieces.

15.e5 Bxd4

Not very different is 15...Nh5 16.Qg5 g6, when instead of 17.g4, which allows Black repetition after 17...Be7, White should essay 17.Nxc6 Qxc6 18.Bxc5 Qxc5 19.Be2 Ng7 20.Rf3, with a certain edge (intending Rh3, etc.)

16.Bxd4 Nh5 17.Qg5 g6?!

Black's position is poor (and White's attacking moves are nearly scripted here), and he needs to look for a better defense, in view of the following. More solid is 17...Nxd4 18.Qxh5 g6 19.Qh6 Qc5! intending ...Qf8. Black's game is still constricted, but he has better chances of holding than in the game.


18.Bg1 Nb4 19.g4 Ng7 20.Bd4

White can already play Rf3; Black has no defense left.

20...Bc6 21.Rf3 Nxd3 22.Rxd3 h5

Otherwise 23.Qh6 is the end.

23.gxh5 Nxh5 24.Rg1 Ng7 25.Rh3 Nf5 26.Qf6 Ng7 27.Qh4, 1-0.

The more popular systems start with 4...g6, but this is also logical.

5.Be2

This is the method prescribed (in a footnote with minimal analysis) by MCO

13. BCO 2 prefers 5.h3 (Razuvayev) Bh5 6.g4 Bg6 7.Ne5 Nc6 8.Nxg6 hxg6 9.Bg2 Qd6 10.Nc3 Nf4 11.Bxf4 Qxf4 12.Qd3 with a slight edge to White.

5...e6

Damjanovic-Gipslis, 1979 went 5...Nc6 6.O-O e6 7.Re1 Be7 8.c3 O-O 9.Nbd2 a6=.

6.c4 Nb6 7.Nc3 Nc6 8.Be3 Be7

The uninitiated might be tempted to "win" a pawn by 8...Bxf3. It's not very good, however, either here or on the next move, for example 9.Bxf3 Nxc4 10.Bxc6+ bxc6 11.Qa4! with more than enough compensation.

9.O-O O-O 10.b3 Bb4 11.Rc1 Ba3 12.Rc2 Bf5 13.Rd2 Bb4 14.Qc1 (Diagram 2)

The last has been an interesting set of maneuvers by Black, and since all it seems to have produced is a rearranging of White's pieces, one might ask what good it is. Black reasons that the Queen is poorly placed on c1 with her diagonal blocked by the Rook. However, the essential gain of tempo thus achieved by White must also be mentioned, as he would normally want his a-rook on d1, to prepare d5 - a tempo he has gotten for free.

14...Qe7 15.Bd3 Bxd3

More solid may be 15...Bg6, to cut off King-side prospects for White, based on the fortress e6-f7-g7-g6. Black does look OK after 16.Bxg6 hxg6 17.Re1 Rad8.

16.Rxd3 Rfd8?!



As will soon be seen, this is the wrong rook. 16...Rad8 is better; if Black later plays ...f5 White has no attack against the f-pawn.

17.Ne4 Ba3 18.Qd1 h6 19.g4! (Diagram 3)

An interesting, and not altogether inappropriate plan - but as we shall see, one made appropriate only by the absence of a rook on f8! A slower alternative was 19.Re1, preparing d5, the thematic thrust.

19...f5

This strike would have been very strong after 16...Rad8, since ...f4 would then be a possibility. Here Black could also play 19...a5 intending ...a4, and if 20.g5 hxg5 21.Bxg5 f6!? 22.Bh4 White has a slight edge, but Black has counterplay.



20.gxf5 exf5 21.Ng3

If Black had moved 16...Rad8, White would have to play 21.Nc3 f4 22.Bd2 Qf6 with a good game for Black.

21...Qf6 22.Bf4 Bd6 23.Bxd6 cxd6 24.Qd2 f4 25.Ne2

Now that Black has committed himself with ...f4, White seeks to win the pawn, and wants to play d5 and Nfd4-e6, which would not only do that but also conquer a critical square. Black should have realized this possibility when playing 23...cxd6; the logical followup to that sequence should have been to prepare ...d5, realizing that the isolated passed d-pawn is no great strength (it will be easy to attack) in this position, and the e5 square can be kept under control by the Nc6. On the other hand, White should also realized this was possible for Black - and therefore should have prevented it by an earlier d5.

25...Rf8 26.Kh1 Rae8? (Diagram 4)

As pointed out above, essential was 26...d5!

27.Rg1 Qf5 28.d5

Black now begins to see the error of his ways. The Ne5 proves ineffectual, while a future Ne6 will dominate the entire board.

28...Ne5 29.Rc3 Nbd7 30.Nfd4 Qh5 31.Nxf4 Qh4 32.Nde6


Ouch! White now has a mating attack. The sequel shows just how strong a Knight can be.

32...Ng4 33.Rh3! Nxf2+ 34.Qxf2!!

Oh dear. If now 34...Qxf2 35.Rxg7+ Kh8 36.Rh6#. The text is also a quick death.


34...Qxh3 35.Rxg7+, 1-0

Since White has a pure mate after 35...Kh8 36.Ng6#.

Why do people play chess? Different people have different reasons

Some actually play to lose. Not many do this for masochistic reasons. Some may lose intentionally as a demonstration of femininity and love, or because of feelings of guilt or as a demonstration of fidelity. But more often give-away players yield as part of a sly calculation of matters beyond the chess board. It is a kind of prostitution. They lose a little honesty and dignity but obtain appreciable material returns in the end.

But most people play for the satisfaction of victory and the overcoming of resistance and obstacles. This is a typical sporting attitude, for the sportsmen of the intellect. God did not necessarily give these people the physical qualities sufficient for superiority over others. So how does one meet this need to be distinguished, to astonish, to prove superiority to others or at least to oneself, to satisfy this unbearable itch in body and soul? Not riddles, puzzles and crosswords but only cards and chess are suitable. However, the cards are more primitive, perilous and dependent on luck; chess is infinite less financially troublesome, and more dependent on the intellect.

Many play chess for aesthetic gratification for the search for the beautiful for artistic creativity. Some play under the influence of habit or from idleness. Some play for the distraction, as they would play solitaire. Some play for money; some play for fame and glory; some play for ratings or for the title of a champion. Seniors and psychologists (older and wiser? - Ed.) play chess for the control over their own and another's state of intellect.

At different periods of my life I regarded chess differently as I was pursuing these diverse aims.

When I emigrated to the USA, tearing away from the Soviet country psychojail that declared me an incurable madman, I chose chess as the objective test for the placing at the American psychiatrists' disposal the facts about my mental state for my psychiatric rehabilitation. This was my purpose during my seven and a half initial months in the promised Colorado land. But I did not give up my literary creative work, my calling, or the renewal of my poetic trilogy LIFE or the publication of this book. At my already beyond middle age I decided to win the title of Colorado State Champion by the force of my will and mind. I also pledged to myself I would win it without studying chess books. So for these first months in the USA regularly on Mondays and sometimes on weekends too I simply played chess at tournaments in the Denver Chess Club.


And so to the tournament: the Colorado Open September 13, 1990: 6 rounds. 82 participants six of them National Masters.

After five rounds I had gathered $4\frac{1}{2}$ points half a point ahead of James Hamblin and other strong players. At last the sixth round brought me together with the champion of New Mexico: young and well-trained Master Jessee Kraal.

I had to win or at least draw. If I drew I would still become State Champion even if Hamblin, treading upon my heels, defeated his opponent and collected an identical number of points, because I had better tiebreak points. I collected my points at games with players who scored higher than Hamblin's opponents. But if I lost, I with my $4\frac{1}{2}$ points would roll away in 3rd 4th place.


This move keeps some advantage in position (the preponderance of space). It also prevents the exchange of the Bf4, limits the possibilities of the Nf6, and for some time bricks up Black's bishop behind the knight. White did not move 16 g4 out of dogmatic, abstract apprehensions of the weakening of the castled position. The active movement of this pawn undeservedly has a reputation with positional players as always adventurous and insecure. I was in fact focusing on a draw and prudence. The enemy of creativity in all kinds of art, prevailed over me.) h6
 17 Bh4 (Subsequent developments showed that it was better to exchange bishop for knight.) Qd7 18 Qf3 Nh7! (A very strong "quiet" move, threatening after the powerful thrust ...f5 to win White's bishop. Here White's only correct reply is 19 g4.) 19 Qe2 (intending 20 f4 to withdraw the bishop from danger) Rae8! (The shattering move. If now White plays 20 f4, Black will strike with 20...Rxe3 and 21...Bd4. (Now let us stop and appraise the position. Black has a bishop for two pawns, which are not dangerous as they still stand on their initial squares. Many "self-respecting" masters facing a material disadvantage at this early stage of the game, would throw in the sponge and surrender. However, chess is a struggle. Of course it would be unseemly to continue the game if White did not have any compensation for Black's bishop; but White has besides two pawns another compensating factor: for the present Black's knight on c7 stands out of the fight, and Black has difficulties getting it into action. There is also an important psychological factor: the young master from New Mexico obviously underestimates the old Coloradan. So White decides to play on. I can always resign later if my opponent continues his forceful play. You see, the result of this game is vitally important to me: if I do not lose, I will be able to exploit the results of this tournament and my Champion's title side by side with my scientific and literary works, for my psychiatric rehabilitation.)


23...Nf8 (Oh, but where is the place for the queen? It is uncomfortable on d3 on account of 24...Rd4 25 Qe2 Qf7. The move 24 Qh5 is bad because of 24...Re5. 

The youthful New Mexico State Champion experienced genuine shock from this loss. Though he maybe soundlessly scolded me as a repulsive, stubborn old fellow he at least did not consider me a madman; nor did the spectators of this dramatic duel.

In this game triumphs creative but not dogmatic strategy: to know how to transgress the principles and rules is often more important for winning than to follow them always unconditionally And this is not extravagant behavior, but a modern, up-to-date, healthy style of thinking.

And another thing: other things being equal there conquers the one for whom the victory is more substantial and vital. The aim gives strength and energy
