The Kiev native edged out Michael Ginat on tie-break points after both scored 5-1 in the Colorado Open on Labor Day Weekend. The Championship Section was the strongest ever, with six players (all Coloradans!) over 2300 and more than half over 2000. Dr. Mikhail Ponomarev had a perfect score after four rounds, but then he ran into the Mighty Michaels.

Rick Mattoon of Pueblo ran away with the Reserve Section, and Sean Scott won the one-day Membership Meeting Open. # 1992 CSCA MEMBERSHIP MEETING

The annual CSCA membership meeting was held on September 6, 1992 at the Ramada Inn Downtown Denver. Approximately 32 CSCA members were present.

The Secretary reported that we had 272 fully paid members prior to the Colorado Open, compared with 289 at this time last year.

The Treasurer reported a loss of \$737 for the past year. However, we had the major expense of a computer for the Informant Editor and the CSCA is still in sound financial condition with assets of \$2650.

Eric Perlman reported a successful year with Scholastic Chess. We had 120 participating in each of two regionals. High school champion was Yuval Laor; Ryan Umari was elementary school champion. Yuval went on to the nationals and placed 16th. out of 25. Ryan placed 11th. in his division.

Chris Hendrickson reported on prison chess: lots of new administrators are taking some breaking in. The program has enough chess sets, but needs books and magazines. Please donate.

The Tour was not quite as active as last year, with about 400 people participating. See elsewhere in this Informant for the winners. The membership voted to remove the 33% floor permanently (this rule required 33% or better in a tournament to get any tour points).

The 1992 US Championships will be held at Durango in December. CSCA is organizing a week-end bus trip from the front range to play in an open tournament and watch the masters play.

The meeting explored several ideas for using computer diskettes and online services (modems attached to computers) to exchange information, results, game scores, and so on.

The membership approved a motion encouraging organizers to hold a greater variety of tournaments (rather than the usual 1800 split between Open and Reserve). There should be different splits and prizes for scholastics; some tournaments could have three sections instead of two.

We had a very interesting discussion about supporting the Fisher-Spassky match, but the feeling that CSCA should stay out of politics prevailed.

The meeting concluded with the election of officers. (See the inside of the front cover for the new Board.) In addition, Vance Aandahl, Richard DeLong, and Garth Courtois were elected voting members to USCF (we have one fewer this year because we lost members relative to other states).

# WHAT IT IS

(A Retrospective Ruminaton)

What's the essence of chess?

Is it a science, an art, an exercise in mechanical engineering, a sport, a religion, a vice, a math problem so complicated a state-of-the-art computer the size of the Milky Way couldn't solve it in a billion years?

Nope.

None of this cuts to the bone.

Listen carefully, fellow patzers, and I will tell you what chess is **really** all about.

On a bitterly cold February weekend a few years ago, fifty chessplayers, most of them experts and masters, gathered in the Glenn Miller Ballroom of the University of Colorado Memorial Center to compete in the Open Section of the Seventh Annual Boulder Open. They came in all shapes and sizes from all walks of life: sociopathic bicycle mechanics, posture-perfect AFA cadets, sleepy-eyed punks, bushy-faced chemistry professors, conscientious young lawyers, stoned construction workers, anarchists, poets, dreamers, failed lovers, cosmic losers, psychotics, pencil-necked geeks, Ferdinand the Bull lookalikes, good ol' boys from West Missouri...

Just a bunch of harmless weirdos, right?

Wrong. Board warriors.

When that chubby nerd with the skim-milk complexion sits down to play, his soul unfolds: he contemplates acts of mayhem so sadistic they'd make Conan the Barbarian sob in horror. This guy's ready to disembowel his opponents and devour their intestines.

The TD posts the pairings for round one and the players find their tables. Silence descends, a silence broken only by the ticking of many chess clocks. Eyes glitter, jaw muscles twitch, foreheads exude sweat, mouths tighten into lines of grim intent. The slaughter has begun.

Nearly three hours later two players stand with their scoresheets and walk in tandem toward the TD's table. The first game to finish has finished. A glance tells me it warn't no draw: yes, the body language says it all: the player who's lagging behind drags his feet with his head down, muttering at his scoresheet as though he's been sentenced to a death camp, while the other struts forth grandly, militarily, face glowing with triumph, like a soldier in a victory parade.

During the second round one of Colorado's strongest experts shows up to spectate. He starts coughing, hacking up phlegm and spitting it into a handkerchief. He's tall and gaunt, bundled up in a big down coat with a moist-looking yellow beard hanging down the front. His coughing fits are deep, explosive, catastrophic, life-threatening. He sounds like he's dying. He's putting out more noise than a troop of baboons barking at a leopard. And he won't go away. He moves slowly from board to board, studying the positions between coughing fits. A few of the players mutter exclamations, curses, or sarcastic prayers. A few others lift their heads, glare at the offender for a moment, then look down again at their games. But the majority show no sign of having heard him at all. You can't survive in combat if you lose your concentration.

When round three ends shortly after midnight on Saturday night, the slaughter has taken its toll. Only a handful of players remain undefeated. The scoresheet box is piled deep with corpses.

During round four, on Sunday morning, someone in the lower section leaps from his chair and zigzags across the room screaming hysterically. Has he lost a pawn? Has he lost his mind? The players in the Open Section don't care. They have more immediate concerns, and their concentration is strong.

Going into the fifth and final round, two of the fifty have perfect scores: Senior Master David Sprenkle from Illinois and the original travelin' man, perennial Grand Prix winner IM Igor Ivanov.

Conducting the white pieces, Sprenkle ventures his specialty, Ponziani's opening. Ivanov reacts aggressively, counterattacking with his f-pawn. The f-pawn is not to be confused with the f-word. It is, in fact the holy pawn. On the 32nd move Sprenkle resigns.

Afterwards Ivanov wanders aimlessly around in the Alferd Packer Lounge carrying a small brown paper sack. My companions tell me it contains a can of Bud and a pint of vodka. How would they know? It doesn't appear to me that Ivanov has been drinking. Instead he seems adrift in nostalgic memories, his eyes soft as a fawn's. He catches some curious glances but no one really stares. He's not **that** eccentric looking--not nearly as eccentric looking as most of us who play the royal game. In fact, he looks rather ordinary.

But then those soft eyes meet mine for a moment. They cut to the bone. Something deep inside me is wounded, slain.

This is no ordinary person: this is the Conan of cognition: this is Lady Caissa's brutal knight, the high lord of the board warriors: this is Igor the Terrible.

And that lethal look in Igor's eyes is what chess is really all about--the essence of its essence.

Yes, my fellow patzers--chess is one thing and one thing only.

A fight to the death.







**The Post-Mortem**  
*Romantic Chess in a Modern Age*  
by Eric S. Perlman

**White:** Keith Oxman

**Black:** Tim Bond

*Giuoco Piano, Möller Attack*  
Pikes Peak Open 1992

One of the oldest, most controversial openings is the Möller attack of the "Italian," referred to as the Giuoco Piano on this side of the Atlantic. White sacrifices a pawn right out of the opening, hoping to exploit his superior development. Nowadays it has the reputation of either being drawish or leading to a slight advantage for Black - but all is not always as it seems, as Keith Oxman shows in this game. On move 16, Oxman tries a piece sacrifice, which Bond accepts one move too early - and carries a strong initiative into the endgame to compensate for a nominal material disadvantage. Inaccurate defense then enables White to convert for the point.

**1.e4 e5 2.Nf3 Nc6 3.Bc4 Bc5**

Choosing the Giuoco Piano over the more complicated - but no worse - Two Knights Defence (beginning with 3...Nf6). That line was previously explored in this column (Cornelison-Lower, Pikes Peak Open 1990; see the October 1990 *Informant*). Black can also choose the Hungarian Defense, 3...Be7, but this cramped line has never been popular.

**4.c3**

Schoolchildren very often choose 4.Nc3 and 5.d3 (or vice versa) at this juncture, giving us a system known as the Giuoco *Pianissimo*. However, GMs sometimes choose 4.d3 intending to play the opening like a Spanish. For example, Nunn-Olafsson, Teesside 1982, began 1.e4 e5 2.Bc4 Nf6 3.d3 Nc6 4.Nf3 Bc5 (this position would be reached from the game after 4.d3 Nf6) 5.O-O d6 6.c3 Qe7 (?! - Nunn) 7.Nbd2 a6 8.Bb3 O-O 9.Re1 Be6 10.Nf1 Ba7 11.Bc2 Kh8 when White has a slight edge. John Nunn, one of the leading advocates of this system, has written some excellent notes to this game, which appear in his book *Secrets of Grandmaster Play*.

Oxman's choice is the oldest and most controversial line.

**4...Nf6 5.d4 exd4 6.cxd4 Bb4+**


Black must play this check; if he doesn't the center pawns crush him.

**7.Nc3!?** (Diagram)

The Möller attack begins with this move, which according to Edward Lasker can be traced back to Greco. White offers a center pawn for open lines and pressure leading, he hopes, to a quick attack. There are two alternatives:

**I.** 7.Bd2 Bxd2+ 8.Nbxd2 d5 9.exd5 Nxd5 10.O-O (10.Qb3 Na5 nearly forces a draw) O-O 11.Ne5! is unclear, but about equal (*MCO*).

**II.** 7.Kf1!? d5 (It is better to equalize the center situation here, especially since White now cannot castle, than take the pawn, as in Marshall-Burn, Ostend 1905 White got a killing attack after 7...Nxe4 8.d5 Ne7 9.Qd4 Nf6 10.Bg5 etc.) 8.exd5 Nxd5 9.Nc3 Be6 with a fine position for Black (*MCO*).



## 7...Nxe4

Along the lines of line II above, the more cautious player might want to play 7...d5 here. However, that move does not equalize. The famous game Steinitz-von Bardleben, Hastings 1895, continued (7...d5) 8.exd5 Nxd5 9.O-O Be6 10.Bg5 Be7 11.Bxd5 (11.Bxe7 also leads to a White edge) 11...Bxd5 12.Nxd5 Qxd5 13.Bxe7 Nxe7 14.Re1 with a clear edge for White, who won in fine style.

## 8.O-O Bxc3 9.d5! Bf6 10.Re1 Ne7 11.Rxe4 d6

Safer than 11...O-O 12.d6 cxd6 13.Bg5 Ng6 14.Qd5, when White has enough for two pawns - all of Black's game is in a hammerlock. Black must be very careful not to fall too far behind in development.

## 12.Bg5 Bxg5 13.Nxg5 h6

Black very obviously wants a good fight too. 13...O-O leads to a well-known draw after 14.Nxh7! Kxh7 15.Qh5 Kg8 16.Rh4 f5! etc. There are reams of analysis on this, which would draw us too far afield. I would recommend looking at *ECO* C54, footnote 63, as well as the analysis of the game Keres-Kunerth, correspondence 1935 in Egon Varnusz's recent compilation *Paul Keres' Best Games*.

## 14.Qh5

This move isn't even mentioned in *MCO*, and is relegated to a small footnote in *ECO* - but it's *BCO* 2's main line! *ECO* gives three main White alternatives:

I. 14.Bb5+ Bd7 (14...c6 15.Nxf7! Kxf7 16.Qf3+ Kg6 - or 16...Kg8 17.Rae1 - 17.Bd3 ±) 15.Qe2 Bxb5 16.Qxb5+ Qd7 17.Qe2! (17.Qxb7 O-O 18.Rae1 Ng6 Kf8 18.Nf3 Nd5 and Black has the edge.

II. 14.Qe2 hxg5 15.Rae1 Be6 16.dxe6 f6 and White has nothing left, Felkel-Zöbisch, Osterreich 1978.

III. 14.Nxf7 Kxf7 15.Qf3+ Nf5! Note that this move was not possible in line I because of the weakness of c6. Either King move is clearly similar to I. 16.g4 Rf8! 17.gxf5 Kg8 and White's attack is ended.

## 14...O-O 15.Rae1 Nf5 16.Nxf7?! (Diagram)

This appellation is *BCO*'s, and I agree with it. *BCO*'s main line is instead 16.Ne6!? fxe6 17.dxe6 Ne7!, with compensation, but probably not enough. However, that line is difficult to assess, for example 18.Rg4 Kh8 19.Re3! with continuing pressure. White's choice is given as being less good, and Black's response is credited to Zak - but no further analysis is given. That line is termed -/+, yet from this game it is obvious that more analysis is needed!

## 16...Qf6!


Quite obviously the sacrifice cannot yet be taken, as 16...Rxf7 17.Re8+ wins the Queen. However, the Knight can't escape either.

## 17.Bd3

Now we are on uncharted ground. White here aims to win the Rook for two minors and continuing pressure. Note that the piece cannot be saved, for example 17.g4 g6 18.Qh3 Nh4! threatens both 19...Nf3+ and also f2 if the Knight moves, so that 19.Nxh6+ Kg7 does very little good. However, Black has a refutation available...and misses it.

## 17...Qxf7?

Obvious - and wrong! The Knight can't escape, so Black can leave the piece alone for one more turn and play 17...Bd7! connecting the Rooks and winning. After that simple move, White's game begins to collapse from over-extension, for example:



I. 18.Rf4 Qxf7 19.Qf3 (after the exchange of Queens there would be no way to regain the piece) 19...Rae8! and White's back rank is too weak.

II. 18.Re6!? - hoping that Black takes the rook first - fails to just 18...Qxf7.

III. 18.Nxh6+ Nxh6! hits f2 and wins.

IV. 18.g4 Nh4! is very similar to the note to White's 17th. White's King is too exposed in this line.

Black does not see that White can exploit his disorganized forces to maintain pressure into the ending where he will have a Rook against two minors, but Black's lack of development will be a big problem.

**18.Qxf7+ Kxf7**


18...Rxf7 19.g4 and 20.Re8+ etc. is identical to the game.

**19.g4! Nh4 20.Rf4+ Kg8 21.Bh7+! Kxh7 22.Rxf8**

We have an endgame, and Black has a slight material edge - yet he is worse because his forces are out of play. If White can double on the eighth, Black can resign, so Black has only one move. This time, he finds it:

**22...Ng6! 23.Rd8 Ne5 24.Re4 b6 25.f4 (Diagram)**

White continues to play actively. Black cannot take the pawn, as that would allow White to double on the 8th rank. However, Black can simplify tactically, based on the weakness of the long diagonal h1-a8.



**25...Bb7! 26.Rxa8 Nf3+ 27.Kg2**

By instinct, one might say that placing the King on the long diagonal must be bad - yet it is the right decision. White's Kingside pawns are a major trump in this ending; they must be preserved. The alternative 27.Kf2 would allow their dissipation via 27...Bxa8 28.Rc4 Bxd5 29.Rxc7 Nxh2 when g4 is also under attack.

**27...Bxa8 28.Rc4**

Of course if 28.Kxf3 Bxd5 and the Rook is pinned - the point of the combination.

**28...Bxd5 29.Rxc7 a5?!**


This move seriously damages Black's chances in this ending. Several endgame analysts - most prominently Shereshevsky (*Endgame Strategy*) and Dvoretsky (*Secrets of Chess Training*) have written that the stronger side usually needs two opposing weaknesses to work on in order to win. With this move, Black hands White a second weakness on a silver platter! Black should still be able to draw, but this move makes his job a lot tougher. Black should instead use his available tempo to play 29...Nd4+ 30.Kg3 Nc6, when his pieces and pawns form a much more cohesive unit.

**30.Kg3 Nd4 31.f5 Kg8 32.Rd7 Bxa2 33.Rxd6**

Now we see the problem - this pawn was lost in any case, but now White also wins the b6-pawn, and Black's majority is destroyed.

**33...Ne2+ 34.Kf2 Nc1 35.Rxb6 a4 (Diagram)**

We now have material equality, but White holds the edge based on his more active King and Kingside pressure. Black must not allow White to gain two connected passers on the Kingside while he goes about winning the b2-pawn. The ending with one passer for each side is a draw, but not with two connected ones for White. Therefore, there are two *critical* squares. Once a White pawn has reached g5 or g6, Black must defend f7 or g8 - or be crushed.



**36.Rb7 Nd3 37.Kc3 Ne5 38.Kf4 Nc4**

The squares f7 and g8 have yet to become critical. Therefore, for one move the Bishop's action may be obstructed.

**39.h4 Bb3 40.g5 hxg5 41.hxg5 Nxb2**

Winning the pawn, and getting off the diagonal just in time. Now that White's pawns have advanced, defending f7 and g8 is a do-or-die proposition for Black. If White can gain access to either square, the g7-pawn falls, and the game is over.

**42.Rb8+ Kf7 43.g6+ Kf6 44.Rb6+ Ke7 45.Rb7+ Kf6 46.Rb6+ Ke7 47.Kg5**

Cutting off f6. Nevertheless, White should not have enough to win, unless Black plays...

**47...Nc4??**

No! The Bishop must be able to defend the f7 and g8 square, so that White cannot win the g7 pawn. 47...Nd3! is the right move; I do not see how White could win the ending after that.

**48.Rb7+ Kf8 49.Rb8+ Ke7 50.Rg8! Nd6**

Now we see why defending g8 and f7 is so critical. Black now has no defense, and even the ingenious 50...a3 just fails to work: 51.Rxg7+ Kf8 52.f6 a2 53.Ra7 (threatens mate!) Ke8 and now White wins via the pretty triangulation 54.g7 (note 54.f7+ Bxf7 55.gxf7+ Kf8 is much tougher) Nd6 55.Kf4 Bc4 56.Ke5 Nf7+ 57.Kd4 Nd6 58.Kc5! when Black is in *zugzwang* and must lose a piece.

**51.Rxg7+ Nf7**

Black sounds the alarm, and tries to distract White from the a-pawn, as well as break up the passers. However, this ending is now a theoretical win. If 51...Kf8 52.f6 the game would have been similar to the previous note.

**52.gxf7 Bxf7 53.Rh7! a3 54.Rh3 a2 55.Ra3**

An important maneuver to remember for Rook endings - the Rook is strongest attacking a passer *from the rear*. Black can resign now, and the rest is given without comment.

**55...Bd5 56.Ra6 Kf7 57.Ra7+ Kf8 58.Kf6 Ke8 59.Kc5 Bf7 60.Kf6 Bd5 61.Kg7 Bc4 62.f6 Bd5 63.Ra5 Bb3 64.Ra8+ Kd7 65.f7 1-0.**
