- 3) Next year's scholastic season will include a third regional tournament, to be organized in Grand Junction by Rand Dodd.
- 4) The Scholastic Team Tournaments will no longer admit "composite" teams from different schools. This practice caused too many problems in the last tournament. Players may still play "up" along feeder school lines. Home schoolers may play on the teams of their designated public school or along its feeder lines.

## Looking Up

The outcomes of all four of my games at the Wyoming Open were affected to some extent by factors other than chess skill. Time management, physical condition, choice of opening systems, and over confidence played an important part in deciding the contests.

In the first round, my talented but inexperienced opponent got into extreme time pressure despite a slow time control (40\2). In a difficult and probably losing position he blundered a rook on his 40th move trying to beat the clock.

With the trend now of organizers experimenting with different time controls, which I like very much, it is important to give more thought to how you should handle your time. Lower rated players often make the mistake of not using their

time. The goal of course should be to use all of your time to your advantage without having to make panic moves at the end of time control or letting the flag fall. At the Craig Chess Club we have a regular player who is an openings expert, but invariably gets into time trouble. I have seen him lose a winnable position on literally dozens of occasions because of time pressure blunders. We also have several young players who simply refuse to use their time and invariably make a mistake because they play too fast.

In the second round of the Wyoming Open I made a disastrous choice of opening systems. After the opening moves 1.e4 c5 2.♘f3 e6 3.d4 cxd4 4.♗xd4 ♘c6 5.♗c3 I played ♗b4. The idea is that





# From Beginner to Expert:

## Lesson for Juniors - Part 1 continued

### 1. Developing a Knowledge of Opening Strategy

At the same time as learning tactics, the coach should also expose the student to the strategy of the opening. In this, however, the coach should not stress openings moves too much. He should stress the ideas behind openings. The coach should introduce three main rules for playing all openings:

1. Develop your pieces.
2. Fight for the center.
3. Provide safety for the king by castling.

### Exercise 8: Exploring General Opening Principles

Two other lessons should also be stressed, in particular: do not develop your queen too early and do not gobble material if the material gain entails falling behind greatly in development. Also, an important rule is not to make passive useless

moves like a3 or a6.

Three illustrative games can be used:

Game 1: 1.e4 e5 2.♘h5? ♘c6 3.♙c4 g6 4.♘f3? ♘f6 5.♘b3? ♘d4! 6.♙f7 ♘e7 7.♘c4 b5! and black wins a piece.

Game 2: 1.e4 e5 2.♘f3 d6 3.♙c4 ♙g4 4.♘c3 h6?? 5.♘e5!! ♙d1?? 6.♙f7 ♘e7 7.♘d5 mate

Game 3: 1.e4 e5 2.♘f3 ♘c6 3.♙c4 ♙c5 4.c3 ♘f6 5.d4 ed 6.cd ♙b4 7.♘c3 ♘e4 8.O-O ♘c3?! 9.bc ♙c3? 10.♘b3!! ♙a1 11.♙f7 and white won.

After general principles of the opening are discussed, the coach should show the student one or two openings with white and one opening against 1.e4 and one opening against 1.d4. The coach should focus on openings which will develop the student's positional understanding. These should be good solid openings that the student can use against any kind of opposition. Trappy openings like the Blackmar-Diemer Gambit, whose at-

tributes lie in the opponent's lack of knowledge lead to one-sidedness in the student's play as he always begins to expect to win out of the opening.

Classical openings like the Chigorin System in the Ruy Lopez are much more preferable. Only 1 or 2 main lines of an opening should be explored. Given the ideas, the student will perfect the details with practice.

### Exercise 9: Selecting an Opening Repertoire

The opening repertoire of a student ought to include openings as diverse as possible, to make sure that the student plays a variety of different positions. Below are some combinations of openings which meet this requirement: 1.Carro-Kann and King's Indian 2.Sicilian and Classical Queen's Gambit 3.Pirc and Nimzo-Indian 4.e4 e5 and Dutch.

The student's openings allow for the closer examination of the strategic ideas involved in a game. In the next part, I will deal with how the coach can better explain strategic ideas in the context of a given opening. I will also discuss how the student can greatly facilitate his own learning process by developing a critical attitude that will allow him to see his mistakes and improve his game.

white cannot defend the Nc3 with a piece without encountering some difficulties and so black is able to create double isolated pawns on the c file. That is all well and good but what black is giving up more than compensates white. Black winds up unable to castle after white gets in the move Ba6 and with a fatal weakness on all of the dark squares. This is the third time I have played this variation against strong players and my third loss. Choosing this move was an attempt at an easy advantage if white mishandled the position. Choices have to be made on much stronger grounds than that.

In the third round my opponent got so wrapped up in his plans that he got swindled out of the win. From the diagrammed position he played dxc4.



I had noticed during the course of the game that he had a tendency to be a bit impatient. When embarking on a three or four move combination he would snap the subsequent moves off automatically. The plan for black here is pretty clear, first dxc4 followed by cxb3 exposing a double attack on the rook on c1. So after he played dxc4 I played f6 which changes everything but my opponent didn't want to take the time to reevaluate the situation and immediately gobbled up the pawn at b3. I was then able to play ♖xc7 and he could not capture back because of the back row mate with the pawn at f6 controlling the g7 square.

By time the fourth round started I was completely exhausted. This was the fourth consecutive weekend that I was playing out of town and I had foolishly gotten involved in other things and gotten only about three hours sleep the night before.

My young opponent wound up with a very difficult position after the opening and I was certain that my game was winnable. After 20 or 25 moves he offered me a draw that I would have been wise to accept under the circumstances but

I didn't want to draw I wanted to win. After another 25 moves I overlooked a devastating combination and wound up in a losing endgame position despite a strong passed pawn. I am fairly certain that fresh and rested I would have won that game.

So we all need to be aware that there are other factors to playing competitive chess besides ones understanding of the nature of the game. As an experienced postal player who is fairly new to over the board chess these factors have been very apparent to me. Ideally a player should come to play a rated game well rested, with a clear understanding of the time control and how he wants to pace himself and prepared to work hard for the win. You can become a much stronger player by working harder during the game and using your time wisely.

Coffee, donuts, and coupons for free food from local restaurants were dispensed throughout the tourney. Players also enjoyed a Sunday lunch of pizza and soft drinks again provided by local restaurants.







A good sound chess trap should be recyclable - as I've pointed out, the old "BxRPch trick" is one of the standard classics (see January 1995 issue of *CCI*, page 9). **NEW IN CHESS**, that superlative Dutch periodical, had an article on the above trap in which they requested from their database, games with the following configuration.




Many games were presented! At the International and Grandmaster level how could this be? Didn't they learn this trap while in kindergarten? Did they skip school? No - it turns out that none of the games featured the usual N-N5ch with the queen follow-up. They were all variations on the theme, which explains why it was successful, in all cases if I remember right. This brings us to the famous Ruy Lopez trap - the NOAH'S ARK TRAP.







# Zeroing in on Piece Values

Last summer when I was sending away for background information on computer chess for the *Rocky Mountain News* chess column, I came across a fascinating article entitled "The Relative Value of the Pieces" in *Computer Chess Reports*. It was based partially on a computer study of 150,000 games by GM Gennady Timoshchenko that was published in the "ICCA Journal" (Dec. 1993 issue).

Of course, as we all learn to play chess, we are taught that a pawn is worth 1, a knight is 3, a bishop is 3+, a rook is 5, and a queen is worth 9. The advanced player will realize that these are very crude approximations and not very accurate in master play. This topic is rarely addressed and typically only found in excerpts written by the great players of days gone by. Today's computer programmers have created a need for a more accurate system in order to have their programs play at higher levels.

It is important to first understand that this is only a fairly accurate approximation and not an exact scale since every specific position is unique. For example, in closed positions knights are more valuable than "bad" bishops and, of course, pawns on the seventh rank that can not be stopped from queening are worth a lot more than your run of the mill, mortal pawn. I am assuming that all other factors on the board are equal for both sides and this discussion only addresses the piece's relative values.

I will analyze and explain the point count system presented by IM Larry Kaufman in *Computer Chess Reports* (Vol.4, No.2). In summary, assign the following values to the pieces: pawn=3, knight=10, bishop=10, 2nd bishop=11, rook=15, and queen=29. The pawn's arbitrary value is 3 instead of 1 so that fractions are not necessary.

The average value of the knight is 10. In the opening or early middle game, one would need to obtain some positional advantage such as an exposed enemy king in order to justify sacrificing a knight for three pawns. A way to think about this is that the side with the extra knight has lots of time left to win back a pawn or two with his extra piece. As more pawns get exchanged, the knight's value decreases. The extreme here is when only the knight and the enemy's three pawns are remaining and, of course, the side with the knight has no winning chances.

Most texts state that the bishop is worth a little more than the knight. In minor piece endings with B vs. N and 4 pawns on each side, Timoshchenko's study showed no advantage to the side with the bishop. As more pawns were added, the side with the knight was slightly favored since the knight could jump over pawns and the long range scope of the bishop was restricted. Conversely, positions with less than four pawns slightly favored the bishop. Timoshchenko also noted two other observations with B vs. N, both with 4 pawns on each side. First, adding queens to each side slightly favors the knight - probably because the Q + N combination works well in forming mating nets around the enemy king. Secondly, adding rooks to each side tends to favor the side with the bishop - perhaps implying that the weakness of the bishop (being able to cover only one color square) is negated by the presence of the long range rook which can cover the squares opposite the bishop. In both cases, however, Timoshchenko concluded a small, 51%, advantage for the favored side. Therefore, the bishop is assigned a value of 10.

Things get interesting with the addi-

tion of the second bishop. Many texts note the strength of a bishop pair. To account for this, we will assign the second bishop the value of 11. Timoshchenko observed that the second bishop pair won 65% of the time over a bishop and knight and 70% of the time over two knights, again with four pawns on each side. Unfortunately, Timoshchenko did not study games with B + N + pawns vs. 2N + pawns. These results suggest that, in general, bishops are slightly better than knights, but not enough for another point (1/3 of a pawn).

The rook is worth 15 which is the same ratio (5:1) that the old scale taught to beginners. Tarrasch claimed that two minor pieces (not two bishops) against a rook (20 vs. 15) was the same advantage as a rook against one minor piece (15 vs. 10). This checks out since the difference for each is +5 which is 1-2/3 pawns. Note that B + N (=20) is worth more than R + P (=18) by about 2/3 of a pawn, which makes sense. The error in the beginner scale should now be obvious since it has B + N = R + P = 6. Also, on this improved scale, 2B = R + 2P (=21), which seems fairly accurate.

The queen is considered worth slightly less than two rooks (30) or three minor pieces (30 or 31). It is worth more than a rook, minor piece and pawn (28) unless the minor piece gives that side a bishop pair. IM Kaufman bases this premise partially on annotations that Garry Kasparov gave to one of his games. Therefore, the lady will be assigned a value of 29. Keep in mind that the actual position on the board greatly influences these positions with queen imbalances. For instance, the queenless side is much better off with a king that is shielded from checks by pawns than when he is exposed, due to the havoc that a queen can create by checking while positioning herself to mop up loose material. Closed positions where the queen's scope can be restricted with maybe outposts for the minor pieces may favor the queenless side.

Hopefully this new piece count system will give you a more accurate way to evaluate material imbalances.
