CONGRATULATIONS, many times over, to Dr. Mikhail Ponomarev for his outstanding win in the Colorado Closed Championship. His fine result, outscoring the field by 1.5 points, shows those of us at and beyond middle age, that hey, we can still say, "The best is yet to come!"

Many people have spoken to me about the great gap in the tournament scene. For between the Colorado Springs Open in March and the Denver Open in July this year there were no, count 'em, zero Tour tournaments and only one other event, the Sudden Death at Regis tournament kindly organized by Mary Nelson. This is too bad. We used to have tournaments like MayDaze and the Rion Swiss in this time. Hopefully organizers will see an opportunity here and schedule some activity for next year. And when you do, please be sure to plan through Tony Wilson, our tournament clearinghouse. The good news is that from July on there will be at least one Tour event each month for the rest of the year.

Be sure to play in the Quick Chess Championship in Colorado Springs on July 19-20. This will be a different kind of tournament, and sounds like much fun. Nate Winterfield has guaranteed a prize fund of \$2000. Match that with a low entry fee and a first-class playing site, and we have the recipe for a great chess tournament.

This year's Colorado Open will be in a new location: the American Motel in west Denver, at I-70 & Kipling. Prices at the Cherry Creek Inn just rose out of sight. The DCC will be having tournaments at the American in the coming months, and Pat Bruno was able to get it for us very inexpensively as part of a package deal.

Ken Schwartz and Roy Heath of the Colorado Springs Chess Club are working on bringing chess back to Pueblo. They are sponsoring tournaments on the last Saturday of each month at the New Frontier Coffee House at 7th & Main, and are working on getting a club meeting there Wednesday evenings. For information call Aaron Love at 583-8754 or Ken at 576-6571 in the Springs.

We are working on getting the 1998 US Closed Championship for Colorado. USCF President Don Schultz has suggested Denver as a good place for it, and we have put in a bid that is now under consideration. Our bid is for November, but things are still flexible to suit the international schedule. If we get it, we will need lots of help running the tournament and making the players happy. Plan on volunteering if possible; there'll be lots to do. Brad Hughes, George Spentzos, Todd Bardwick, and I are the official tournament committee at the moment. ☺





SCHOLASTIC NEWS

The last two months have been busy ones for our scholastic members. Ft. Lupton, Storage Tek, and the U.S. Supnationals (Tenn.), were the highlights.

Ft. Lupton hosted their tournament March 8th. There were 4 divisions: K-6, 7-12 unrated and K-6, 7-12 rated. Anthony Davis, Daniel Rozeboom and Abe Nunez were victorious in the unrated K-6 section. John Thiesen, Trent Pologar, and Steve Milo won the 7-12 section. Travis Yee, Dane Karras and Ryan Putros topped the rated K-6. Joey Dorlaque, Isaac Garcia and Boris Davis won the 7-12 section. The Davis-Dorlaque family had a clean sweep with all three boys coming home with trophies.

Storage Tek Scholastic was April 13th. As always Bruce Galler and Art Rudesal were superior hosts. Two hundred and ten students played. This was the largest tournament (other than the state championships) to date. The 7-12 Rated section contained quite a few high rated players. Khotam Kudratov was the winner with 4.5 points beating Jack Maynes in tie-breaks. In the Unrated sections the winners were as follows:

The highlight of the 96-97 year was the USCF Super-Nationals held in Knoxville, Tenn. Forty-two Colorado students attended. This was the first year that USCF has held all grade level championships at one location. There were 4300 students (and twice as many parents) in attendance. All competition was held in one gigantic hall. The tournament was ran very well considering the hordes of people. The bughouse and blitz tournaments, held before the championships, were not as well organized, which frustrated parents and students alike.

Everyone enjoyed themselves despite the inconveniences of large gatherings. It was great to see the sportsmanship of the Colorado players. Each one encouraged the other, helping each to cope with the highs and lows of victory and defeat. Knoxville as a convention city left much to be desired, but the experience for all made the trip well worth the competitive adventure.

David Baldwin had the best performance with 6 points of a possible 7. He tied for fourth which tie-broke to 12th place in the Open 8th grade division. Jeff Pennington won 5 games for 23rd. Sean Cabrerra was 5.0 for 25th. Mark Janvrin, Ryan Butros, Jacob Wallace and Jacob Herold won class awards. Irving Middle School won several school team awards. Each division awarded 25 trophies for individual and school teams. There were 13 divisions according to grade and rating.

Katie Roberts-Hoffman and Josh Bloomer won 12th in bughouse. Josh Wallace won 4th and Sean Cabrerra won 9th in Blitz.

The Dawson School in Lafayette will host a summer tournament August 9th. Entries will be in the mail or call Joyce (841-41290, Bruce (443-7270) or Art (449-5635) or Donna (988-3773).

The '97-'98 school year calendar of scholastic events will be published and sent out in August with the entry blanks for the September Tournament at ACC. Now on with a couple of games. Neither of these are actual submissions, and due to circumstances, biographies were not obtained. Both games are crushing defeats put on me by a couple of our brightest stars. First off, Jeffrey Pennington catches me thinking attack, and blindsides me with a defensive but attacking move.

Mike Fuchs (1644) - Jeffrey Pennington (1280?)

(Since I don't write down ratings when I play, I pulled this from the ratings given through the link in my page) Sudden Death at Regis II, round two

I gave this an exclamation point because it surprised me - what vision I have!? This is a very interesting choice. Obviously, I can bail out and maintain material equality, but to do so I lose a couple of tempi.

11. cb cb

Absolutely the right choice.

12. Ne5

Perhaps Nb5 puts up a better fight?

Always thinking attack, I liked the looks of 12. ... ba 13. Ba3 and Rc1. It looked like pressure might come from that.

12 ... Be5 13. fe ba 14. Bh7

I'm pretty happy with this position

14. ... Rf8 15. Qg6+ Rf7

Suddenly this doesn't look quite as good. 15. Bg6+ probably offers better chances for white.

16. Rf1 Qc7

What an exquisite move. I was so focused on the queen's defense of f7, I didn't see my impending doom. Now, white must play Rb1, Rf7, Kd1, Qg3 or Qg5

17. Ba3?? Qe4+ 18. Kd1 Qa1+ 19. Ke2??

Until I sat down to write this little column, I didn't realize that Bc1 would have kept the game alive to some extent, as black must answer the threat of Bg8, and his queen is out of the picture.

19. ... Qf1+ 20. Ke3 Nf5+

White resigns, 0-1. Wow, did I ever get punished for my errors. A great job by Jeffrey to see more of the game than just his side of the board.

The next game is from the same tournament, a quick and painful defeat at the hands of Phillip Ponomarev. While this does not necessarily highlight Phillip's ability real well, it does show the value of grabbing the gifts when they are given. Phillip hesitated only slightly when I offered my gifts, taking the pieces off the board quickly and with relish, leaving me to slink away with my tail between my legs.

CLOSED CHAMPIONSHIP

A tradition is being carried on. Last year Sean Scott retired as sponsor / director of the Colorado Closed Championship tournament, and there was ominous talk of that being the "Last Colorado Closed." Not so! Your CSCA continued the tournament. As president I arranged the site, invited the players, went through the last-minute headaches, and was delighted to see things turn out well.

We held the tournament at the Chess Emporium Studio in downtown Denver, with Chris Mink directing. CSCA paid the expenses involved, and sweetened the prize fund with an additional \$100 over and above the players' entry fees.

As usual, there was a crisis at the 11th hour. A master who had earlier told me he would play withdrew days before the tournament was to start. I called a strong Expert who had played in the Closed before. He accepted, but later changed his mind and had to withdraw. So at almost literally the last minute I started phoning 2100 players and was fortunate to get a "Yes" from Craig Wilcox. And he did good, our Craig! Playing against competition rated way above him, he scored a very respectable 3 points out of 7.

The hero of the tournament was Dr. Mikhail Ponomarev, the ??? Colorado State Champion. At the age of 71, Dr. P played sharp, vigorous, imaginative chess to dominate the tournament and finish a point and a half ahead of his nearest rivals. He was followed by the powerful trio of McCarty, Kearns, and Anderson; these guys all lost to Dr P, each other (McCarty beat Anderson who beat Kearns who beat McCarty.), and another player, so no one was able to stand out from the field. Maybe next year... Brian Wall had his ups and downs, scoring against the top finishers but losing to the bottom. Michael Ginat and Randy Canney were not in their best form, and finished at the tail end. They'll be back.

All in all, it was a fine tournament. No one went undefeated or winless. There were upsets and surprises, blunders and brilliancies, sacrifices and sucker-fices. Some games stood out particularly: Wilcox - Anderson, Ponomarev - Anderson, Ginat - McCarty, Kearns - Ponomarev, Wall - Canney, and Anderson - Kearns.

Enjoy these games. Many are worth careful study. Finally, a note to participants and other strong players: If you have questions or suggestions on the running of future Closed Championships, please get them to me.

This move could lead to a loss for my son. But I give it an exclamation mark. I rejoice at my son's boldness and his yearning for beauty. I am bringing my son up not to strive for the faultlessness of the accountant or the computer, not to the worship of the cult of the win at any price, characteristic of modern professional chessplayers. I cultivate in him a taste of the poetry of

chess, for the pleasure of the game. I teach him to understand chess as a fight of personalities, not intellectual machines. Intuition and psychological factors play very important roles, and not only in the game of chess.
